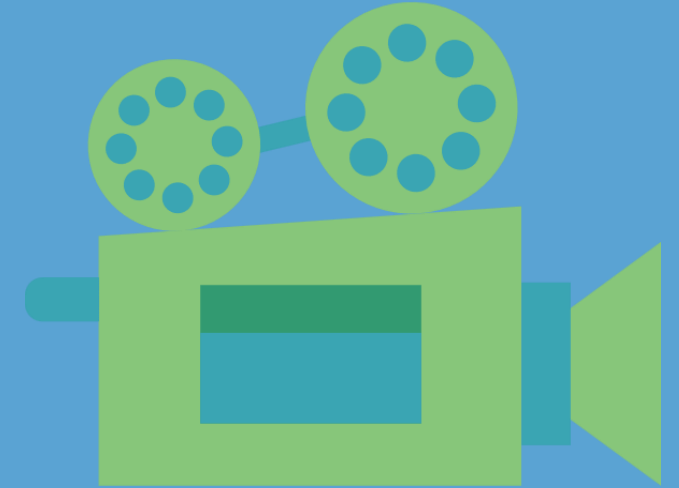


Smoke-free Screens

Four Critical Issues

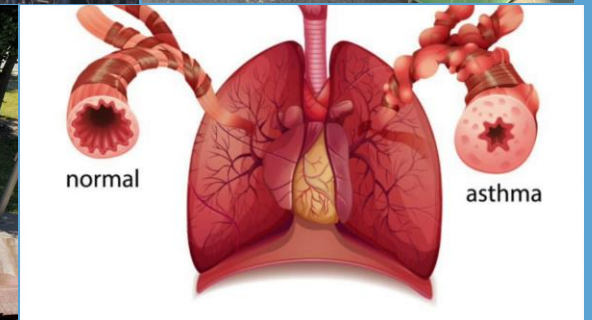
1. How much/how often smoking is seen on screen?
2. Who is using tobacco/cannabis products?
3. How is tobacco/cannabis portrayed?
4. Where are these products being used?

Tobacco glamorization distorts reality – makes tobacco use seem more common than it is and rarely depicts the negative effects of tobacco use. It can make tobacco use seem cool, normal, harmless, and desirable.

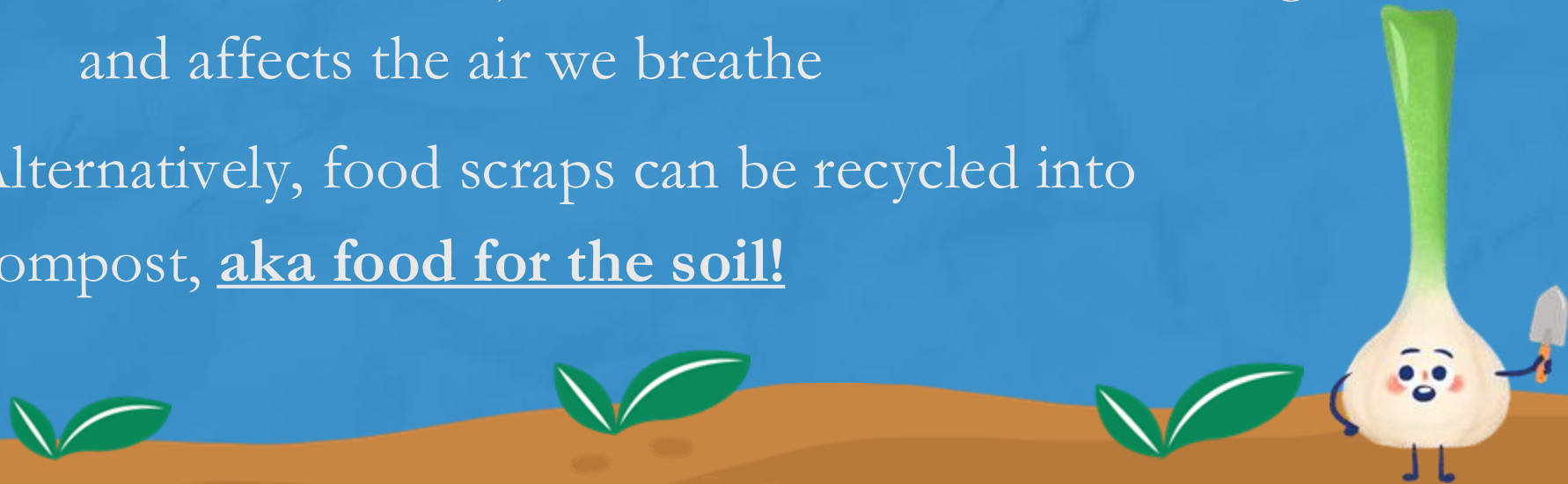

WHY RECYCLE FOOD SCRAPS?

- Landfilled food waste can take decades to decompose
- As landfilled food decomposes, it releases **Methane**, a powerful greenhouse gas
 - Methane = a major contributor to climate change and affects the air we breathe
- Alternatively, food scraps can be recycled into compost, aka food for the soil!

It can take **25 years** for a head of lettuce to decompose in a landfill



SB 1383 - Mandatory Organics Recycling Regulations

- ◆ Educate staff and students on organic waste prevention and how to properly sort waste
- ◆ Staff & students must sort their waste in the proper bins
- ◆ Provide containers & signage
- ◆ Recover edible food by 2024...

- Builds healthy habits

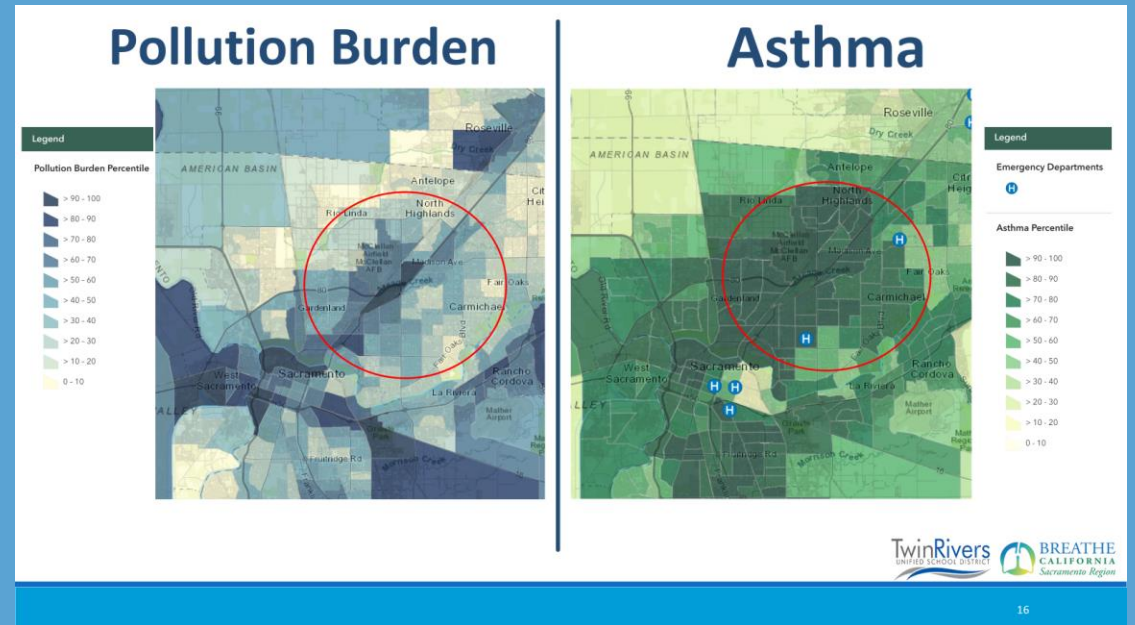
